

Information for Proposal Submission

Else Kröner Fresenius Award for Development Cooperation in Medicine 2023

"Leprosy"

Please note the following information when submitting a proposal for the Else Kröner Fresenius Award for Development Cooperation in Medicine 2023:

The award is intended to be used to honor one project pertaining to the topic and the person mainly managing the project as award winner.

The prerequisites for submitting a proposal are:

The project:

- ✓ The project must serve the strengthening of diagnosis, treatment or reconstructive therapy for leprosy in developing countries and make lasting, inclusion-oriented care and follow-up care accessible to all segments of the population.
- ✓ The project ought to be exemplary. The award is given for readily achieved successes.
- The award money in the amount of 100,000 euros is intended to be utilized for further development of the project. To that end, a concept is to be submitted in the course of proposal submission (see below).
- ✓ Proposal submission for the award can be made for projects in developing countries which are defined as such by the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD). You can find the criteria along with the current list of countries here.
- ✓ The project may not have been funded or supported by Else Kröner-Fresenius-Stiftung until now.
- ✓ The projects that can be honored are those which are currently running and have already been running for at least one year, and shall be continued for at least one more year.

The award winner:

- ✓ The award winner ought to be outstandingly involved in the project and a decisive influence in designing the project.
- √ The person being honored must be professionally qualified and possess years of occupational experience.

The proposal-submitting organization:

- ✓ Proposal submission is to occur via the lead organization sponsoring the project.
- The organization must be a non-profit or public-law entity based in Germany or a foreign country within Europe (incl. EFTA countries and the UK). State-run and state-affiliated organizations are excluded from proposal submission.
- If a proposal submission is presented jointly by multiple organizations, a lead project-managing person in charge is to be designated.
- Proposal submission by one or multiple organizations must state the person who is supposed to be awarded the prize.
- ✓ The proposal-submitting organization and/or lead applicant organization acts as the funding recipient and is obliged to administrate the funds from the foundation.

The proposal:

- ✓ The proposal submitted (without title page and appendices) may not be more than five pages.
- The title page ought to include the title of the project, the name of and contact data for the proposalsubmitting organization along with the data for the person authorized to represent it, the proposed award winner, as well as a brief depiction of the project (maximum half a page).
- The proposal submitted must present the following aspects: context, relevance, activities implemented, target groups reached, key milestones achieved and project successes. In addition, it is to be stated for what purpose the award money from EKFS is supposed to be utilized.
- ✓ The proposal submitted must be written in German or English.

- ✓ Cooperation commitment on the part of involved partner organization(s)
- ✓ Proof of the non-profit status of the proposal-submitting organization
- ✓ As needed, proof of the DZI Seal of Approval for Donations
- ✓ Declaration of consent to the storing of data
