Else Kröner Fresenius Award for Development Cooperation in Medicine 2025

Outreach Services

Please note the following information when submitting a proposal for the Else Kröner Fresenius Award for Development Cooperation in Medicine 2025:

The award is intended to be used to honor one project pertaining to the topic and the person mainly managing the project as award winner.

The prerequisites for submitting a proposal are:

The project:

- ✓ The project aims to reach people who can only receive inadequate basic healthcare without outreach services. Educational and awareness-raising measures as well as preventative and curative services are to be offered.
- ✓ Health workers from the existing health care structure as well as village communities and village or community health workers are to be involved and receive further training as part of the project.
- ✓ The concept should be so efficient and resource-saving that it can be adopted by the government public health system.
- ✓ The project ought to be exemplary. The award is given for readily achieved successes.
- ✓ The award money in the amount of 100,000 euros is intended to be utilized for further development of the project. To that end, a concept is to be submitted in the course of proposal submission (see below).
- ✓ Proposal submission for the award can be made for projects in developing countries which are defined as such by the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD). - ✓ Exceptions are countries with difficult security situations or unstable political conditions. Please enquire individually.
- ✓ The project may not have been funded or supported by Else Kröner-Fresenius-Stiftung until now.
- ✓ The projects that can be honored are those which are currently running and have already been running for at least two years, and shall be continued for at least one more year.

The award winner:

- ✓ The award winner ought to be outstandingly involved in the project and needs to have a decisive influence in designing the project.
- ✓ The person being honored must be professionally qualified and possess many years of professional experience.

The proposal-submitting organization:

- ✓ Proposal submission is to occur via the the lead organization responsible for the project.
- ✓ The organization must be a non-profit or public-law entity based in Germany or a foreign country within Europe (incl. EFTA countries and the UK). State-run and state-affiliated organizations are excluded from proposal submission.
- ✓ If a proposal is presented jointly by multiple organizations, one person in charge bearing accountability is to be designated.
- ✓ The proposal-submitting organization and/or lead applicant organization acts as the funding recipient and is obliged to administrate the funding resources from the foundation.

The proposal:

- ✓ The proposal submitted (without title page and appendices) may not be more than five pages.
- ✓ The title page ought to include the title of the project, the name(s) of and contact data for the proposal-submitting organization(s) along with the data for the person authorized to represent it and the proposed award winner, as well as a brief depiction of the project (maximum half a page).
- ✓ The proposal submitted must present the following aspects: context, relevance, activities already implemented, number of people benefiting from the project, key milestones and project successes already achieved. In addition, an outline, logframe and budget for utilization of the award money are to be submitted.
- ✓ The proposal submitted must be written in German or English.

The attached appendices:

- ✓ Cooperation commitment of the partner organization(s)
- ✓ Proof of the non-profit status of the proposal-submitting organization
- ✓ Declaration of consent to the storing of data

The proposal documents are to be submitted in a digital format and sent to the email address j.bitzer@ekfs.de by April 21, 2025.
